Fantastic School Results

We have had our best ever end of Key Stage results at Key Stages 1 and 2 and exceeded national averages at both Year 2 and 6. Our Year 6 results were amazing. A far higher proportion of our children achieved the highest outcome in reading and maths than do nationally. Our provisional progress scores (the thing that really matters most) are well above the threshold for the highest category, in both subjects. With many children joining us with very different starting points, results will go up and down from year to year. However, these results clearly show that children at Mauldeth Road benefit from an exceptionally good learning environment and teaching. Confirmed final results will be sent out in the Autumn Term, as we are awaiting reviews on some papers. Very well done to all concerned!
